

PSALM 116: THE WORSHIPER'S SONG OF PRAISE

Psalm 116:1-19

1. The worshiper shares his bedrock emotion: **I LOVE THE LORD**!

- 2. The worshiper shares his reasons:
 - God has heard his **<u>CRY</u>**!
 - God has lifted him out of his **<u>PIT OF DESPAIR**</u>!
 - God **<u>LIBERATED</u>** him!

3. The worshiper shares his resolve: "I will..."

• I will **LIVE** right.

• I will **<u>BELIEVE</u>** right.

• I will **<u>PRAY</u>** right.

• I will **PERFORM** right.

• I will **FAITHFULLY PRAISE** right.

PRAISE THE LORD!

GETTING STARTED

- 1. Do you like roller-coasters? Is your life like a roller-coaster? A ferris wheel? A slow-moving train? How so?
- 2. **Read Psalm 116** and review your message notes. What stood out to you from the message this week? Do you have questions? Disagreements? Discuss it with your group.

DISCUSS

- 3. Psalm 116 is a psalm of thanksgiving. This week we're going to study another psalm of thanksgiving, Psalm 30. **Read Psalm 30.** Open it up next to **Psalm 116**. What parallels do you see between the two? How are they similar? How do they contrast? Take some time to observe and ask questions about the text.
- 4. For what reasons does David praise God (**Psalm 30:1-3**)? How does he account for why the Lord allowed these hard times to come upon him?
- 5. What do you learn about the Lord's anger in **verse 5**?
- 6. What error did David make? (See verses 6-7) Is it wrong to feel secure or desire security?
- 7. How does David argue that God should spare him in verse 9?
- 8. Did you notice why this Psalm was written? It is for the "dedication of the Temple". Why would David write *this* Psalm for that occasion? **Go read 1 Chronicles 22 for some insight.**

UP CLOSE

- 9. Is security important to you? How much of your money goes toward buying a house? Medical and life insurance? Savings? Where does security lie?
- 10. Has God turned a time of wailing into a time of dancing for you? Was it "overnight", surprising you with joy? Or did things change more gradually?
- 11. How is the theme of "sorrow producing joy" developed in the New Testament (see John 16:19-22 and 2 Corinthians 4:16-18)? For what are you "mourning"? How long has your "night" been? How long until "morning" comes?
