Ecclesiastes 3:11; 1:12-18; 2:1-26

I observed everything going on under the sun,

and really, it is all meaningless —like chasing the wind. (ν . 1:14)

Ecclesiastes 2:1-23

pleasure (2:1-11)

wisdom (2:12-17)

- 7. How is light better than darkness? What does this say about the differences between wisdom and folly?
- 8. Why is Solomon so unhappy with what many would call success?

- 9. What is the most important project you have undertaken in the last year? How do you measure your success in that?
- 10. In Ecclesiastes 7:4 Solomon says, "A wise person thinks a lot about death, while a fool thinks only about having a good time." (NLT) Do you think much about death? Do you regard death as the final tragedy or the final triumph? Is the death of the fool different from that of the wise? How can you prepare yourself for death?
- 11. How does a book like Ecclesiastes help you focus on the truly important things in life? What are they?
