
Getting Started

- What is your favorite Christmas memory/tradition/song? What was Christmas like for you as a child? What is it like now?
- 2. **Read Galatians 4:1-7.** Review your message notes. What stood out to you from the message this week? Do you have questions? Disagreements? Discuss it with your group.

Digging Deeper

During this series, our study will follow the traditional season of Advent, and reflect on Jesus' first (and second) coming.

- Read Isaiah 9:1-7. With the help of the map find the regions of Zebulun, Naphtali and Galilee and the road called "the Way of the Sea." This road marked the western limits of Palestine and the Jordan marked the eastern limits.
- 4. When Isaiah writes Chapter 9, he is writing during a time when Israel's king, Ahaz, has turned away from the sign God gave him... times are dark and the future bleak. But Isaiah writes about a future King (Jesus) who will make things right. Describe a time you have felt surrounded by darkness, and the future seemed bleak.
- What changes does Isaiah predict when Jesus, the *light* of the world, comes? (v. 2-5)



- 6. To get an idea of the people's state of mind when Isaiah writes, go back and **Read Isaiah 8:19-22.**
- 7. How do you think the people reacted, then, when they heard Isaiah's predictions in 9:2-5?
- 8. Isaiah continues to speak of this new ruler who is to come in verses 6-7. What is He like?
- 9. Take time to reflect on and discuss each name of Jesus in v. 6.

Up Close

- 10. Which of the descriptions of Jesus in **Isaiah 9:6-7** Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace best describes Jesus as you have known him during a time of difficulty and/or darkness?
- 11. Which description of him do you most long to experience right now?
- 12. As you close and as we approach Christmas, consider the description of Jesus in Isaiah 9. Thank him for coming. Thank him that he'll come again and finish what he has begun. Look back through the outline from this past Sunday: "We were slaves but God sent Jesus to free us and adopt us to be family!" Give thanks and praise to Jesus for the truth of that statement!
