Adopted son of a king. (Ex. 2:10)	Son of the Most High. (Luke 1:32)
Raised by adoptive parents.	Raised by an adoptive dad.
Raised in Egypt.	Spent much of his childhood in Egypt.
Trained and educated well growing up in Egypt.	Likely trained and educated well as a boy in Egypt.
Rescued any who trust God, leading them out of captivity with great power.	Rescues any who trust God, leading them out of captivity with great power.

Sees suffering and takes action.	Sees suffering and takes action.
Spends 40 years as a shepherd (Ex. 3:1)	The Good Shepherd (John 10:11, 14)
Spends 40 years in wilderness.	Spends 40 days in the wilderness.
Known for his meekness. (Num 12:3)	Known for his meekness. (Mat 11:29)

Descendant of Abraham through Levi.	Descendant of Abraham through Judah.

Performed miracles.	Performed miracles.
Provided bread in the wilderness. (Exodus 16:35)	Fed the 5,000 with 2 loaves of bread. (John 6:1-13)
Receives and teaches the Law.	Teaches, expands, and fulfills the Law.
Often met privately and personally in a special way with God.	Often spent time in prayer, sharing a special relationship with God the Father.
Leader of Israel.	Head of the Church.
Face shone with glory after meeting with God.	Face shown with glory after the transfiguration.
Constantly prayed for and interceded for God's people.	Continually is interceding for his people. (Romans 8:34, Heb. 7:25)
Willing to die for God's people. (Ex. 32:32)	Died for his people. (1John 3:16; John 15:13)
The greatest of the OT prophets, speaking the Word of God.	The greatest prophet, speaking the Word of God. (Matthew 21:46)
Gave commands for God's people to follow.	Gave commandments for his people to obey. (John 13:34; 15:12, 17; Gal 6:2)
Mediated the Old Covenant between God and his people. (Exodus 34:27; Acts 7:44)	Mediated the New Covenant between God and his people. (Luke 22:20; Hebrews 9:15)
Prophesied of Jesus (Deut. 18:15).	Revealed it's all about him. (Lk. 24:27, 44)
