Getting Started

1. Open in prayer. Then **Read Exodus 1:15 - 2:25.** Review your message notes. What stood out to you from the message this week? Do you have questions? Disagreements? Discuss it with your group.

What is this? – Each week people from Wawasee Bible meet in small groups in various homes to learn about Jesus, pray, eat, laugh, and live life together. We call them 1:10 Community Groups (the "1:10" comes from Colossians 1:10). The questions here are based on the sermon each week (often a parallel passage of Scripture), and guide each group's study. If you're interested in connecting with a 1:10 Group, let us know on the Connect Card in your bulletin.

- 2. When is a time that you questioned what God was doing? Did you ever have a time you wondered if you'd ruined God's plans?
- 3. When we talk about the balance between God's part and our part in dealing with our circumstances, at times we can end up in one of two unhealthy extremes. One would be inaction, leaving all results to God. The other would be depending on our own efforts so much that there is little room for God's presence and direction. Which extreme would you have to be most aware of in the following areas:

 - What can we learn about how we and others respond to God's will from this story?
