Exodus 4:18-31

Jesus **WANTS TO** use you (v. 18-23)

Be wise; prepare well; honor others (v. 18)

He will be with you (v. 19-23)

but requires **REPENTANCE** and **OBEDIENCE**

(v. 24-26)

***NOTE: This is a strange, strange passage...**

Background: Genesis 17:1-14

It's confusing and hard to understand... Isaiah 55:8-9; Deuteronomy 29:29

It's here for a reason and can teach us something... 2 Timothy 3:16-17

1. It's all or nothing.

2. It starts at home.

(v. 27-31)

God keeps his promises to Moses → *and to you!*

God goes with Moses → *and with you!*

God works as Moses obeyed → *and as you obey!*

HOMework

What is this? – Each week people from Wawasee Bible meet in small groups in various homes to learn about Jesus, pray, eat, laugh, and live life together. We call them 1:10 Community Groups (the “1:10” comes from Colossians 1:10). The questions here are based on the sermon each week (often a parallel passage of Scripture), and guide each group’s study. Getting Started

1. **Getting to Know You:** What is the longest journey you’ve ever taken? It could be long in terms of time, or farthest away from home you’ve been, etc.
2. **Read Exodus 4:18-31.** Review your message notes. What stood out to you from the message this week? Do you have questions? Disagreements? Discuss it with your group.

Digging Deeper

3. Being willing to look at our shortcomings, sin and failure can be no small challenge when it comes to owning up to our stuff. Yet remembering our need for forgiveness and God’s incredible provision is actually what frees us to live as he designed us to. How do the following verses help motivate us to be open and honest about our sin or lack of doing the right thing?

Isaiah 53:6

Isaiah 59:1-3

Isaiah 55:6-7

4. King David is a good example of someone who faced failure and sin in his life. Jot down the steps you see David taking in **Psalms 51:1-17** to look seriously at his own issues?
5. When it comes to dealing with your own failure and sin, is there any part of David’s prayer that would be helpful for you to use?
6. None of us want to fall back into sin and failure after realizing the harm to God, ourselves and/or others. But we all have seen others, or experienced ourselves, the reality of moving back into godless living. Fortunately, God has given us some spiritual practices that can help decrease the temptation to presume upon God’s second chances and at the same time strengthen us for consistent obedience in doing the right thing. How might the following passages speak to this?
