# HOMework

**What is this?** – Each week people from Wawasee Bible meet in small groups in various homes to learn about Jesus, pray, eat, laugh, and live life together. We call them 1:10 Community Groups (the “1:10” comes from Colossians 1:10). The questions here are based on the sermon each week (often a parallel passage of Scripture), and guide each group’s study. If you’re interested in connecting with a 1:10 Group, let us know on the Connect Card in your bulletin.

## Getting Started

1. **Getting to Know You:** *What’s your best 4th of July or summer weekend memory?*
2. **Read Exodus 15:1-21.** Review your message notes. What stood out to you from the message this week? Do you have questions? Disagreements? Discuss it with your group.

## Digging Deeper

3. This week we saw that God is greatly to be praised and some reasons we should worship him. In **1 Chronicles 16:7-36**, King David gives instructions to the worship leaders of Israel on how and why we should worship. Read this passage and jot down the insights you see about the how and the why of worship.
  - What stands out to you the most about worship from this passage?
  - If our God is good and his love endures forever (verse 34), why would fear and trembling before him be appropriate (verses 25 and 30)?
  - Based on this weekend’s sermon, what would you say to an unchurched friend who asked you why Christians sing worship songs at church?
4. When things got difficult for them, the Israelites could praise God for the Red Sea experience in their past and the Promised Land in their future. As Christians, when we’re in tough times we can praise God for the cross in the past and the Kingdom of God in the future. How do you see these truths about the sea and the Promised Land and the cross and the kingdom reinforced in the passages below?

5. During the Last Supper, Jesus was aware of how difficult the next few days would be for his disciples as they struggled with fear, doubt and anxiety. He spent most of this last conversation with them before his death preparing them for the challenges to come. In the following passages from that dinner conversation, write down the statements and promises Jesus makes that could provide us with comfort and encouragement to praise and worship as we face challenging times.
