HOMEWORK

What is this? — Each week people from Wawasee Bible meet in small groups in various homes to learn about Jesus, pray, eat, laugh, and live life together. We call them Life Groups. The questions here are based on the sermon each week (often a parallel passage of Scripture), and guide each group's study. Getting Started

Getting to Know You: If you have new people in your group, be sure to introduce everyone and share a little about who you are. After that: *How many times have you moved in your life? Where is the place/city/home you enjoyed living at most? Least?*

Review your message notes and this week's Scripture. What stood out to you from the message this week? Do you have questions? Disagreements? Discuss it with your group.

Benefits of Patience

- 1. Take a patience inventory. At what times and in what circumstances do you tend to be impatient?
- Read the following verses from the book of Proverbs: 14:29; 15:18; 16:32; 19:11; and 25:15.
 How would you summarize the qualities of a patient person? What contrasts are drawn between a patient and an impatient person?
- 3. According to **Proverbs 15:18**, how does patience/impatience affect our relationships with others? How have you seen patience/impatience affected relationships your life?
- 4. Reread Proverbs 16:32. Why do you think a patient person is better than a warrior or one who takes a city? How could patience be a great asset in your (choose one) workplace, classroom, home?
- How does patience—or the lack of it—reveal whether a person is wise or foolish (14:29; 19:11)?
- 6. Think of a person you know who is very patient. In what other ways does that person seem wise?
- 7. According to **Proverbs 15:18** and **25:15**, how does patience or impatience affect the impact of our speech?
- 8. Look at **Proverbs 16:32** and **25:15**. What is the difference between patience and passiveness?
- 9. What is the difference between patience and powerlessness?
- Why do some people mistake God's patience for passiveness or powerlessness? See 2 Peter
 3:9, 15; Romans 2:4; Joel 2:13; Psalm 103:8
