Part 7 | God's Peculiar People

1 Peter 2:4-10

⁴ As you come to him, a living stone rejected by men but in the sight of God chosen and precious, ⁵ you yourselves like living stones are being built up as a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. ⁶ For it stands in Scripture:

"Behold, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious, and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame."

⁷ So the honor is for you who believe, but for those who do not believe,

"The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone,"

8 and "A stone of stumbling, and a rock of offense."

They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do.

⁹ But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. ¹⁰ Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

Do you ever have a hard time believing that Jesus understands the difficulties you face in life? If so, explain.

2. One of the primary responsibilities of the Old Testament priests was to offer the various sacrifices required by the law. While these sacrifices are no longer applicable today, there are still sacrifices that Christians are called to make. What do you find challenging about making the sacrifices found in the passages below? How do you think they were able to mature in such a trying situation?
