Questions & Scripture for Further Study

This summer we're in a series called "Word to the Wise". We'll be studying parts of the book of Proverbs and seeking the wisdom it offers. Have you every wanted wisdom? James tells us it's a good thing and we should ask for it (James 1:5), but there's also some effort to be put in on our end. Scripture makes it clear we don't get wisdom on accident but by searching for it like a hidden treasure (Proverbs 2:1-22).

This summer let's make an effort to read from Proverbs every day.

Since Proverbs has 31 chapters, a practical way to do this is to daily read the chapter that corresponds to the day of the month and consider these questions:

- **1. What applies to me today?** (And how can I do it—in thought, attitude, word, or deed?)
- 2. Where have I seen this in others?
- 3. Where have I experienced this?

Ideas to Maximize Your Reading of Proverbs:

Pick a Time: If we want to make something happen, we usually need to set a time when it will actually happen. Consider your options.

Mark it Up: Have a pen in hand to jot down notes and underline those verses that catch your attention. It will be encouraging to look back at what you wrote after you've done this over time. **Write Down Your Thoughts:** Get a notebook and write down anytime you have a response to one of the three questions above.

Use an App: Below are sites/apps that have Proverbs reading plans for your smartphone, tablet or computer. There is even an audio option for listening instead of reading. Each app allows you to mark up verses, jot down notes, as well as share your thoughts with friends.

"Do not **make** your **hired** workers **wait** until the **next** day to **receive** their pay. ¹⁴ "Do not **insult** the **deaf** or **cause** the **blind** to **stumble**. You must **fear** your God; I am the **LORD**. ¹⁵ "Do not **twist justice** in **legal matters** by **favoring** the **poor** or **being partial** to the **rich** and **powerful**. **Always judge people fairly**. ¹⁶ "Do not **spread slanderous gossip** among your **people**. "Do not **stand idly** by when your **neighbor's** life is threatened. I am the **LORD**. ¹⁷ "Do not nurse hatred in your heart for any of your relatives. Confront **people** directly so you will not **be** held guilty for their sin. ¹⁸ "Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against a fellow Israelite, but love your **neighbor** as yourself. I am the **LORD**.
