



Study Guide

Questions & Scripture for Further Study

What is this? — Each week people from Wawasee Bible meet in small groups in various homes to learn about Jesus, pray, eat, laugh, and live life together. We call them Life Groups. 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1. Do you think much about what Jesus is doing right now?

- 2. What is "intercession"?
- 3. What does it mean that Jesus intercedes for us? How does that calm and reassure you right now? Do you think that doctrine is neglected today? Why?
- 4. What is the relationship between intercession, justification, and atonement?
- 5. Have you realized that, if you are in Christ, he himself is praying for you? How does this transform or strengthen your own prayer life?

Read John 2:1-6. Jot down anything that is striking to you.	

- 6. What is the difference between an intercessor and an advocate? Why is Christ's role as both important?
- 7. What does an advocate do?
- 8. What are some truths about Jesus the advocate, as taught in 1 John 2:1?
- 9. What's the significance of the word, "propitiation" in v.2?
- 10. Why do you need an advocate? How does Christ's advocacy impact your life?
