

1. When you think of the Holy Spirit, what comes to mind? Did you learn anything about him this week and/or from this passage?

- 2. According to John 14 (and you can find more in John 16), what is the work of the Holy Spirit?
- 3. Based on John Chapters 14-16, why did Jesus say the Spirit needed to come?
- 4. What are some of the implications of the fact that the Holy Spirit is not an impersonal force but a person? How do you tend to think of him?

- 5. What do we learn about the Father here?
