When his **mother Mary** had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. 19 And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. 20 But as he **considered** these **things**, **behold**, an **angel** of the **Lord** appeared to him

in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take **Mary** as your wife, for that which is **conceived** in her is from the **Holy Spirit**. ²¹ She will **bear** a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." ²² All this **took place** to fulfill what the **Lord** had spoken by the prophet: ²³ "Behold, the virgin shall **conceive** and **bear** a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us).


