Digging Deeper – A Bible Study

Use this guide for further personal and group study this week. For the most impact in your life and in your group, *work through it on your own before you gather with your Life Group.* If your Life Group isn't gathering this week, use this guide for further study personally.

- 1. Is there anything about your family of origin that makes you question if God could or would really want to work in and through your life? If you feel comfortable, share a bit with your group.
- 2. In **Genesis 24**, Sarah has died, and now Abraham is nearing the end of his life. Remembering God's promise to him, Abraham begins focusing on finding a wife for his son, Isaac. **Read Genesis 12:1-3; 15:1-6; 17:1-8, 15-21** to be reminded of God's promise to Abraham, then **read Genesis 24:1-9**.
 - Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything you heard for the first time, that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you? Discuss it with your group before moving on.

3. Read Genesis 24:10-28.

- What are your thoughts on how God answered Abraham's servant's prayer?
- Do you pray about things "in the moment" like that? Have you ever seen God clearly answer those prayers?
- What's keeping you from talking to God regularly in the moment-to-moment situations of life?

4. Read Genesis 24:29-67.

- Take some time to think through this whole account. What was it like for Abraham's servant? Rebekah? Rebekah's family? For Isaac???
- In his faithfulness, God orchestrates a lot of events here. As you look back at your own life, how has God either orchestrated or used certain events in your life (or your ancestor's lives) to show his faithful love to you?

Read Genesis 25:19-28.

 God again overcomes some humanly impossible situations (overcoming Rebekah's barrenness) to give Isaac and Rebekah a child. And he's generous to give them two! — Have you ever seen God overcome a seemingly impossible obstacle in your life?

Taking It Home

6. Genesis 25:22-28 is a prelude to all kinds of family dysfunction yet to come in Jacob's life. Maybe you can relate... The reality is every person and every family has degrees of dysfunction at work in their lives. It's part of the sin-broken world we live in.

With that in mind, as we set off on this study of Jacob's life, is there a specific struggle or family situation you'd like your group to be praying about with you? — If you're comfortable, here's your invitation to share it with your group.

Prayer

As you close, take time to pray for each other. A few guidelines:

- Keep your sharing brief so that any who want to share have time.
- As you are listening to others, listen. Be empathetic and slow to speak. You're not there to fix it, you're listening so you can pray that God will work!
- Consider splitting into smaller groups of 3 or 4 to pray. (You might even split into smaller groups for the sharing time.) Then be sure each person is prayed for by two others in the group.
