Digging Deeper – A Bible Study

- 1. Take some time to review your message notes. Looking back, was there anything that particularly caught your attention, challenged or confused you this week? Discuss it with your group before moving on.
- Read Genesis 25:29-34 and Hebrews 12:16–17. Why do you think Esau was willing to sell his birthright for a bowl of soup?
 - What does this event say about the character of Esau and Jacob?
 - Esau's (and later his dad's) physical appetite caused him to forfeit some things in the future. What are some of your appetites? Are you "feeding" them temporarily or eternally?

Read Genesis 27:1-17.

- What do Rebekah's plans and Jacob's participation say about them?
- What is Jacob most concerned about?
- What does all this say about Isaac and Rebekah's home? (look back at 25:18)

Study Guide (continued)

4. Read Genesis 27:18-29.

 Jacob and Rebekah use deception to obtain Isaac's blessing. Were they wrong to do so? Is there a situation where deception is acceptable? Why or why not?

Read Genesis 27:30-40.

- Jacob's deception and manipulation of Esau sets a pattern of behavior for him. Are there any negative patterns of behavior in your life? How can you break out of them?
- What's the cost to those you love if you don't? (Think about how Isaac and Rebekah's patterns affected Esau and Jacob...)
- **Read Romans 9:1-33.** (Consider reading it in a more modern translation like the NLT or NIrV.) God's sovereignty is inscrutable; His ways are a mystery to us. God's election—of Abraham, Jacob, Israel, and of Christians today—rests entirely on His mercy. As believers, our reflection on God's election should lead where it does for Paul—to praise of God's mercy.
 - How does Paul's argument in Romans 9 help you understand God's election? Why does he choose to save us?
 - It is easy as a Christian to take God's mercy for granted. What are some practical ways you can recall the grace & mercy God has shown you in your life?

Taking it Home

Jacob's story and Paul's struggle against "flesh" do not leave us hopeless, or excuse poor decisions, for Paul also states that in Christ we are a "new creation." We are raised to a new life through and because of Christ—a life in which sin has been conquered and we are empowered to live free of it.
